

Beckley School PE and Sport Grant 2016 – 2017

November 2016

The purpose of this document is to explain how Beckley School intends to spend the PE and Sports Grant for the 2016 – 2017 academic year.

OCC Guidance on how to use the grant:

The following is included to provide schools with guidance as to how they can use the PE and sport premium. Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This means that you should use the premium to:

- *develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers*
- *make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years*

For example, you can use your funding to:

- *hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers*
- *provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively*
- *introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport*
- *support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs*
- *run sport competitions*
- *increase pupils' participation in the School Games*
- *run sports activities with other schools*

You should not use your funding to:

- *employ coaches or specialist teachers to cover planning preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements - these should come out of your core staffing budgets*
- *teach the minimum requirements of the national curriculum - including those specified for swimming (or, in the case of academies and free schools, to teach your existing PE curriculum)*

The funding allocation is £8,000 plus £5 per pupil in Years 1 – 6. Beckley School has been allocated £8,620.

Note: CPD opportunities have been focussed on the areas that staff feel less confident teaching.
